A Story of Thanksgiving

The challenges of the pandemic have taken a toll on families living in poverty.

COVID has closed schools and overloaded fragile healthcare systems. Merlyn Zuelma Zambrano and her family are safe in Honduras, but they are struggling. They want you to know they are grateful that Canadian families are walking alongside them throughout this difficult path.

Estefany and Erlin, Merlyn's children, miss their friends. They are doing some school work at home, but the family does not own a computer. It's tough to do their school work on the small screen of a cellphone.

Merlyn is grateful that her neighbours continue to buy her tortillas. During the pandemic the cost of corn has gone up and families have less income to spend. Their business is down, but they are surviving. Merlyn says, "I am grateful to God that people are still buying my tortillas and that my family is getting by."

Through Free a Family® programs, Merlyn and her family have received critical pandemic resources: masks, antibacterial gel and liquid soap. Her family has also been learning more about the best safety protocols during these dangerous times.

Merlyn is also participating in a sustainable agricultural program. It's a great opportunity to supplement her income and to put nutritious food on her family's table. And, most importantly, Merlyn and her family are able to look to the future with hope, even in the midst of trying times.

Children's Message/Sermon

I want to tell you a story about a little girl named Tiwonge.

You might think Tiwonge is an unusual name—but it's the most popular girl's name in Zambia. Like Ava or Emma; Olivia or Sophia in Canada.

Tiwonge means "Let's give thanks!"

Isn't that a great name!

But there are some days that Tiwonge doesn't feel like being thankful. Do you ever feel that way?

Some days, Tiwonge thinks, the hot sun chases every cloud from the sky. You see, it can be very hot where Tiwonge lives. So hot it seems like the sun burns every green leaf! Right now, when you are pulling out your mitts and boots, Tiwonge is heading into summer! But even the winter isn't cold. She has never, ever seen snow. She can't even imagine what it feels like to build a snow man or toboggan down a snowy hill.

But this year, Tiwonge has something to be very thankful for. This year, her mom and dad are able to buy soybean seeds for a very low price—because of gifts from families like yours. Now, who here has ever seen a soybean?

Soybeans are very important where Tiwonge lives. Her family can grind the beans up and use it like flour to make bread or baked goods. You can also use soybean for oil. It's very valuable at the market. When her parents sell their soybean crop, they have money to buy food, school supplies, medicine, and other essentials.

Tiwonge's parents put the soybean seeds into the ground. Tiwonge helps by playing with her younger brother and sister while her parents work in the fields.

Then they pray that the sun would warm the soil, causing the seed to grow. They also pray for rain to water the soil.

And when they harvest their crop, the whole family celebrates! Just like we're celebrating today.

Can we think of some ways God helped Tiwonge and her family?

- He brings the sun to warm the soil
- He sends the rain to water the crop
- He protects Tiwonge and her family from sickness, so they can plant and harvest the crop
