Amanda, 14, lives with her maternal grandparents in Gindiri, a small town in Nigeria. Amanda's grandparents raised her. "She was diagnosed with cerebral palsy when she was six months old," they say. "She relies solely on others to feed, bathe, and clothe her." Because her grandparents are subsistence farmers, they don't make enough to buy Amanda a wheelchair or to enroll her in a special school that could provide her with the support and care she needs.

As Amanda grew, it became more and more difficult for her grandparents to carry her around, so they were forced to confine her to her room when she was six years old. After World Renew learned about the family's struggles, Amanda was offered a wheelchair. Although Amanda can neither speak nor hear, the smile on her face expressed all the joy she felt.

"I appreciate you for putting a smile on Amanda's face and making life a little easier for us," says Amanda's grandfather. "The wheelchair is a big relief for us all."
